Speakers

Katy Maag, BSN, RN, CCRP has worked in Cardiac and Pulmonary Rehab for over 18 years and is employed as a Registered Nurse at Mercy Health in Lima, Ohio. She is a Certified Cardiac Rehabilitation Professional (CCRP). She finds daily contact with the patients energizing and inspiring. She is currently serving as President of OACVPR.

Heather Shuster, MS is the manager of Population Health & Wellness at Genesis Hospital in Zanesville, Ohio and past-president of the Ohio Association of Cardiovascular & Pulmonary Rehab. She has over 12 years of experience in Population Health in areas of focus, such as community wellness, public health, cardiovascular health and employee health & wellness programming. She is experienced in developing programming for early admission into cardiac rehabilitation such as "See you in 7" for AMI/Stent patients and "See you in 14" for CABG patients.

Belinda Mahon is an exercise physiologist at Genesis Hospital in Zanesville, Ohio with 14 years of experience in cardiovascular health. Belinda holds certifications in ACSM's "Exercise is Medicine" and is a CCEP.

Sam Sears, PhD is a Professor in the Departments of Psychology and Cardiovascular Sciences at East Carolina University. He also serves as the Director of Doctoral Studies in the Department of Psychology. Dr. Sears is considered by many as the world authority on the psychological care and quality of life outcomes of patients with implantable cardioverter defibrillator (ICD) patients. He has published well over 150 articles in the medicine and psychology research literatures and provides lectures all over the world on a regular basis. Recently, Dr. Sears created a smart phone app, called "ICD Coach" that is the first ever app for cardiac patients focused on successful coping. His presentations have been well-received throughout the USA and internationally.

Janie Knipper, RN, MA, MAACVPR is a Clinical Practice Leader for the Pulmonary Rehabilitation Program at The University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics in Iowa City, IA. She has experience over the past 26 years in pulmonary rehab. She served on the Board of Directors of the Iowa Association of Cardiopulmonary Rehabilitation since 1994. She also served the AACVPR as the Pulmonary Nurse on the BOD, as well as serving on numerous committees. She is recently retired, but continuing to work occasionally in the UIHC Pulmonary Rehabilitation Program, and also continues to serve as the pulmonary rehab regulatory resource person for the AACVPR.

Dr. Jeffery Swartz, MD, FAAP is the Medical Director of the Falcon Health Center at Bowling Green State University. He's a 1977 BGSU graduate who earned his M.D. at the Medical College of Ohio in Toledo and is board certified in family medicine. Carolyn Knox, MSW, LISW works full time as a Clinical Medical Social Worker in the Advanced Heart and Vascular Center outpatient clinic. Her role is to assess patients' physical, medical, and emotional needs and coordinate referrals and linkage with community resources for patients with chronic disease, i.e. home health care, alcohol and drug resource linkage, mental health resources, and general support in living and coping with chronic illness. She conducts psychosocial evaluation of patients being considered for Left Ventricular Assist Device (LVAD). She also provides support to LVAD patients and family and coordinates monthly LVAD support groups.

Lisa Foote, BSN, RN has been a Staff RN for 32+ years in an acute care setting with experience in care of the cardiac, post open heart, vascular, thoracic, and general surgery patients. Most of her clinical experience focused on the intermediate open-heart patient including caring for patients with an LVAD (left ventricular assist device). Her current role is the Clinical Program Coordinator for VAD working for patients with advanced heart failure who receive a heart pump / LVAD (left ventricular assist device).
